- Not Home Health
- Non-medical Care
- Certified Nurse Assistant or Personal Care Aid



Companionship Assistance

- ♥ Transfers
- ♥ Bathing

- ♥ Cooking/Eating
- Medication Reminders
- ♥ Others Upon Request

Household Assistance

"77% of adults aged 50 and above prefer to be in their home for the long term." AARP 2021

HOW DO I KNOW IF I NEED HOME CARE?

MOBILITY

- Help navigating around home
- Avoiding Falls/Accidents
- Assistance w/ Everyday Tasks

MEMORY

- Avoiding Safety Hazards
- Ensuring proper diet & medication compliance

COMPANIONSHIP

LIMITED FAMILY ASSISTANCE

- No Nearby Family
- Family Member Unable to Assist
- Burned-out Family Members (>60% of family caregivers report suffering from depression)

WHICH HOME CARE COMPANY DO I CHOOSE?

Independent Caregivers

Caregiver Registries Traditional Home Care Agency

WHAT SHOULD I KNOW ABOUT INDEPENDENT CAREGIVERS?

(1099 independent contractor caregivers that you employ)

Pros:

- You're the boss & can hire/fire whoever you like
- Caregiver consistency
- Lowest Cost: \$12-\$18/hour
- Flexibility

Cons:

- You'll need to arrange all of the following:
 - Recruiting, interviewing, background check & references
 - Written agreement/contract
 - Liability Insurance & Occupational Accident Insurance
 - Payroll & Tax forms
 - Ongoing Communication w/ Caregiver
- Backup if/when caregiver out?

WHAT SHOULD I KNOW ABOUT CAREGIVER REGISTRIES?

Examples: Care.com, CareLinx, A Place for Mom

Pros:

- You're the boss & can hire/fire whoever you like
- Lower than average Hourly Cost: \$12-\$18/hour
- Flexibility
- Help with recruiting, background checks & references

Cons:

- You'll need to arrange all of the following:
 - Written agreement/contract
 - Liability Insurance & Occupational Accident Insurance
 - Payroll & Tax forms
 - Ongoing Communication w/ Caregiver
- Backup if/when caregiver out?

WHAT SHOULD I KNOW ABOUT TRADITIONAL HOME CARE AGENCIES?

Examples: FirstLight, Griswold, Home Instead


Pros:

- Less Hassle (company handles everything!)
- Professional Input & Support/Recommendations
- Access to Back-up Caregivers

Cons:

- Highest Cost: \$28-\$31/hour
- Less Control: May not get to pick caregiver
- Less Caregiver Consistency (may have rotating group of different caregivers)
- Less Experienced Staff (may be brand new caregiver)
- Caregivers may be limited in types of assistance



HOME CARE OPTIONS TO CONSIDER

- Hours per Week
 - Will determine which home care company you go with
 - Some have no minimum, some of a daily or weekly minimum
- Hourly vs Live-in vs. Recruitment Fee Only
 - Potentially HUGE savings for having a live-in caregiver
 - Paying for 13 hrs/day vs paying for 24/7




OTHER QUESTIONS TO ASK WHEN SHOPPING HOME CARE AGENCIES

- Type of Payment Accepted
 - Most are Private Pay
 - Some take Long-term Care Insurance, VA
 - Few take Medicaid/Medicare (limited coverage available)
- Caregiver Background Checks?
- Caregivers Insured?
- Minimum Hours per shift or week?
- Meet Caregiver ahead of time?
- Keep same Caregiver?



IS HOME READY FOR HOME CARE?

- A master bedroom and bath on the first floor
- Grab bars in bathroom & on bed
- Wheel chair ramps
- Lever-style door handles
- Bright lighting in all areas
- Non-slip flooring, especially at the entryway
- An open floor plan, especially in the kitchen and dining area
- Handrails in key locations
- Chair lifts
- Medical Alert System (Life Alert) & Smart Home Devices
